# GRANT FUNDING GUIDELINES CENTRAL REGION

### Funding of Positions

- Applicant must:
  - Show proof of regional benefit within answers of application
  - Clear scope of work with a defined end and marked deliverables
  - Define the period of how many years grant would fund position

### Sustainability/Phased Projects/Maintenance

- Applicants must:
  - Answer the sustainability question clearly in application
  - Must indicate an 'end date' of a phased project
  - Identify long term funding plan to sustain the projects (i.e. local funds, other grant sources, etc)
  - Clearly state what accomplishment have already been achieved in phased projects
- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)-Replacement PPE typically is a jurisdictional expense. The standard practice is that jurisdictions should provide their own replacement PPE; however, exceptions may be made on a case-by-case basis

### Training/Exercise

- Regional training & exercise funds are essential
- Overtime and backfill are not authorized expenses for regional training funds (MOU to DEMA)

### Regional Response Capabilities

- Preference will be placed on projects that have a true regional capacity

### Citizen Corps Training

- Those seeking funds must be registered at the National level
- Must be active participant in the Arizona Central Region Citizens Corps Program (ACRCCC)

### Other

- Requests for standard operational equipment must be able to clearly identify a terrorism nexus and how the equipment would move the agency toward greater capability to respond to a terrorism-related event
- RAC members encourage applicants to attend the grant funding recommendation meetings. This facilitates dialogue between applicant and RAC members during the meeting if additional information is necessary for RAC members to make informed recommendations
- The Central RAC reserves the right to request supplemental information from applicants
